## What is the Kaitaia Business Association (KBA)

- Not-for-profit, registered Incorporated Society established in 2012 to support the Business Improvement District (BID).
- We have an Executive Committee made up volunteers.
- Various roles including Chair, Deputy Chair, Treasurer, and up to 8 Committee members.
- Each committee member represent an organisation within the BID.
- Representatives from the Te Hiku Community Board, FNDC, and the Kaitaia Police.



## What is the Kaitaia Business Association (KBA)


- Committee voted in every 12 months at AGM
- Meet last Wednesday of every month.
- Have several steering groups to help drive projects, and members are welcome to join a steering group.
- We support 250+ local businesses, organisations and commercial building owners.
- We advocate on behalf of our members and drive projects that aim to improve economic outcomes for our BID.



## What is the BID?

- The Business Improvement District (BID) is a defined area within Kaitaia.
- All businesses, organisations and commercial property owners within the defined area are members of the BID and the KBA.
- Funded by a levy on those commercial buildings within the BID collected through council rates and managed by the KBA.
- Used to support initiatives to enhance the physical environment, support businesses, and help to create a safe, warm and welcoming business district.
- Those businesses outside the BID can join the KBA as Associate Members

## Challenges - As an organisation (KBA)

#### Challenges - As a community

- SH1 Brynderwyn closure
- Significant power outages
- Terrible weather events

- Tough economic times

But... we are a resilient bunch here in Kaitaia and many have not only survived, but thrived.



#### Te Hiku Business Boosters

- Facilitated numerous small business and resilience based courses through our training arm, Te Hiku Business Boosters and our delivery partner, Building Safer Communities.
- Courses included First Aid training, Situational Safety, Sleep workshops, Cultivating Resilience, Effective Leadership, Food Safety & Hygiene Certificate, HR & Management training, Success for Small Businesses, and many more.
- Our Committee also worked very hard to bring Besafe Training Ltd to Kaitaia to facilitate the BeSafe Site Passport and Working at Heights certificates.
- 225 attendees across all courses!





#### Apprentice / Trainee Scholarship

- Since November last year, we have awarded three \$1500 training scholarships to three different businesses without our BID
- Kaitaia Glass & Aluminium, Top North Sports & Spinal Physiotherapy, Retreatment Skin & Beauty
- Funds are used to support the costs associated with training new & existing team members.

#### **Road Trip North Campaign**

- Worked alongside Kerikeri and Kaikohe Business Associations to showcase Northland as open for business during the Brynderwyns closure.
- We used this as an opportunity to showcase some of our businesses.
- Secured funding to bring More FM Northland to Kaitaia during the closure to promote our town as the gateway to paradise.
- A number of businesses participated from across Kaitaia, Ahipara, and out as far as Waiharara.
- They broadcast live from Te Ahu and talked about all the good things we have going on in Kaitaia and the wider Te Hiku region.

#### **Business After 5**

- Launched a new informal monthly networking event.
- Last Thursday of every month.
- Started off strongly with good engagement.
- Unfortunately, the last Thursday of the month aligns with numerous public holiday weekends, so we lost some momentum.
- We haven't given up though, so watch this space.





#### **CCTV Monitoring for Safer Communities**

- KBA, alongside our partners, Total Security and the Kaitaia Police, manage and monitor the CCTV network.
- Primarily supports the business district.
- Some costly repairs & maintenance, and some cameras replaced to ensure good coverage.
- Proved to be very useful for both prevention and investigation of crime.
- Downward trend of incidents being noted during monitoring between Sep 23 and Aug 24.
- However requests for active support and official requests for support while monitoring are on the increase. System proving valuable.
